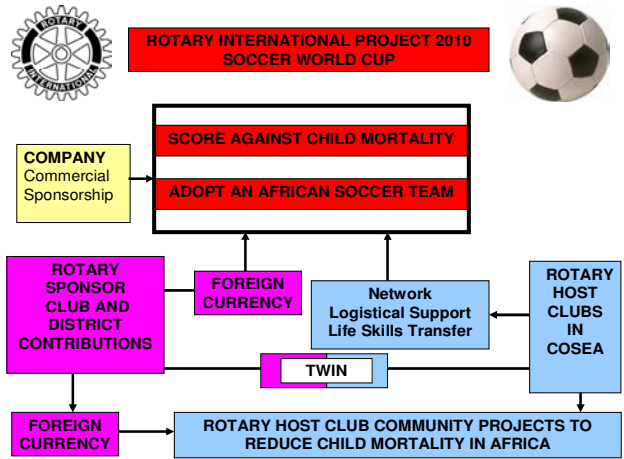

Score against Child Mortality - Adopt an African Soccer Team

Between 11 June and 11 July 2010 an estimated 2.7 million spectators will watch the FIFA Soccer World Cup. 64 matches will be played around South Africa. When the final match is shown, a television audience of up to 2.8 billion people will have their eyes glued to South Africa. What are Rotarians going to do about this once in a lifetime opportunity?

The aim of the SCORE AGAINST CHILD MORTALITY - ADOPT AN AFRICAN SOCCER TEAM project is to get each Rotary club in COSEA – The Rotary Governors' Council of Southern and East Africa - to adopt a soccer team from a local disadvantaged community. The Rotary Host clubs will provide the network and sustain the project at grassroots level. They will also be instrumental in the transfer of Life Skills to young people who will be under the impression that this project is all about soccer. The project will solicit company sponsorship as well as the support of overseas Rotary clubs and Districts who will sponsor the soccer teams but will also contribute towards community projects to reduce child Mortality in Africa. Linking this project to Child Mortality will set it apart from hundreds of other 2010 Soccer World Cup Projects. Each overseas Rotary Sponsor club and District will be twinned with a Rotary Host club in COSEA.

During the June 2010 School Holidays an Inter District Soccer Tournament will be organized where the winners in each category from the 8 Districts will compete. While those youngsters with real soccer talent will be given the opportunity to be chosen for the Southern & East African Team, all the other participating teams will be given the opportunity to obtain non-soccer accolades. District 9320 Goals 2009—2010

At the District Assembly held in Colesberg on 19 April 2009 delegates considered and confirmed the adoption of the following Goals: 100% of the clubs in the district should achieve a Rotary International President's Citation. Each club is to **increase membership** by at least 10%. Each club is to **retain** at least 80% of members inducted before July 2009. Each club will strive to meet the **Every Rotarian Every Year** challenge of a contribution of 100 US Dollars per Rotarian per Year to the Rotary Foundation. Each club will strive to contribute 10 US Dollars per Rotarian to the **Polio**

YOUR club must qualify for a Presidential Citation

Plus Challenge. Each club will undertake and complete an activity from three of the six categories in the **Presidential Citation** between 1 July 2009 and 31 March 2010.

1. Eradicate polio
2. Advance the recognition and public image of Rotary.
3. Increase Rotary's capacity to provide service
4. Expand membership globally both in numbers and in quality
5. Emphasize Rotary's unique vocational service commitment
6. Optimize leadership talents within Rotary International

THE SILENT KILLER

Cervical cancer is one of the hidden diseases. It gets about half the media attention that breast cancer gets.

Yet in South Africa, you have a greater risk of developing cervical cancer than breast cancer, and your risk is roughly twice as high as for women in the rest of the world. 30.2 per 100 000 will get cervical cancer, as opposed to 16 per 100 000 in the rest of the world.

(Just for comparison, 27 in 100 000 South African women will get breast cancer, 5.4 will get lung cancer and 4.1 get ovarian cancer.) More than 3 600 South African women die of cervical cancer every year.*

EASY HOT CHOCOLATE PUDDING - INGREDIENTS

Bake: 500 g GOLDEN CLOUD - Chocolate Muffin Mix
2 eggs
180 ml oil
225 ml water

Sauce: 500 ml Soft brown sugar
500 ml Boiling water
60 ml cocoa

METHOD

1. Preheat oven to 180°C
2. Combine Muffin Mix & wet ingredients for 1 minute with electric beater.
3. Pour batter into a 30 x 30 cm baking dish.
4. In a saucepan combine sauce ingredients & boil until sugar dissolves.
5. Pour sauce over the batter & bake for 40 minutes
6. Serve warm with ice-cream or whipped cream
